CREATION FEST COMES TO CORNWALL!

After seven successful years in Devon, Britain's premier free Christian music festival, Creation Fest, has relocated to Cornwall. Excitement is building concerning the re-launch of the music, teaching and worship event which this year has expanded to a seven-day festival. To be held from 7th to 13th August at the Royal Cornwall Showground in Wadebridge, Cornwall, the event has something for everyone, from full-on rock music to acoustic solo artists; from five-a-side football tournaments to seminars; from skate-boarding to chilling out in the late night café; from fun-filled children's presentations to in-depth Bible studies.

Said organiser Phil Pechonis, "We are thrilled at the opportunity of bringing an expanded Creation Fest to Cornwall. Over the years we built up a successful weekend event in Woolacombe, Devon, but it became clear last year that we were outgrowing our present facilities. In view of this, we took the bold step to relocate to the Royal Cornwall Showground. This will mean that some of the events and attractions will now be able to be held indoors, there will be hugely improved parking and camping facilities, and there will be numerous other benefits. One of the things we are most pleased about is that Creation Fest will continue to be a free event, although a small charge is being made for camping facilities."

One of the many acts on the expanded Creation Fest music attractions are Manchester's thebandwithnname, whose 'Dying To Be There' album was named Contemporary Album Of The Year by Britain's Christian Broadcasting Council. Other acts set to play are Afro funk favourites Four Kornerz, hip-hop and streetbeat team LZ7, Californian worship leader Scott Cunningham, radical hip-hop man E-Tizz, rock funk iconoclasts [dweeb], rock evangelists Superhero, pop princess Philippa Hanna, Northern Irish fourpiece [crave], R&B girl group BlushUK, Bournemouth rock outfit Bosh, edgy singer/songwriter Shell Perris, blues rock journeymen Verra Cruz, acoustic rock and soul man Finchley, gutsy rock trio The Steels, alternative punk rockers MaLoKai, festival favourites Narrowpath, holy hip-hop band New Direction Crew and Cambridge-based band Empire Nation.

Phil Pechonis also commented, "As always, the vision of the festival is to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ through contemporary Christian music. Creation Fest offers something for all the family with a full programme of music, teaching seminars, workshops, sports activities, films, and family fun. We also have a massive skate/BMX park with professional skate demos throughout the festival. With the expansion of the event we really feel we are entering a new era with the potential to reach thousands with a life-changing message."
